WHY VISIONING? AREN'T WE DOING ENOUGH?

As I write this, we are a week away from the Church Council's Visioning Retreat. My deep-down feeling is that this day will be just the beginning of a process of bringing the ministry of Pine Street UMC into sharper focus.

My best hope is that, by the time you read this, the staff and Council will have connected with the "heart" of our congregation! We will have attempted to prayerfully discern why God has placed us in ministry at 441 Pine Street in 2012 and asked God to guide us in our next faithful steps.

Visioning is not necessarily about planning to do more, but about discerning those ministries in which we will focus. Visioning often results in a congregation's deciding to do a few things with excellence rather than accomplishing many things that bear less fruit. Visioning saves a congregation from random busy-ness by creating a single focus which all may embrace. Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. This mission does not change. Vision is revised from time to time and answers the question of "how" we will make disciples of Jesus Christ.

When a church's vision is clear, all leaders, committees, staff, members, and other resources are accountable to that vision. I think of the movie "Drumline" with its memorable line: ONE BAND, ONE SOUND! A congregation with a clear vision is like that! One band of believers making a unified "sound." That "sound" will distinguish this congregation's ministry from that of the dozens of other congregations in our community. Resources will undergird the vision, rather than being scattered in too many directions. Vision can help a congregation move from doing *good* things to doing the *best* things!

Stay tuned, and remain in prayer for God to move in a powerful way through the leaders and members of Pine Street UMC!

Nothing matters more than a teen knowing God's purpose for his life, because it simplifies his decisions and removes confusion.

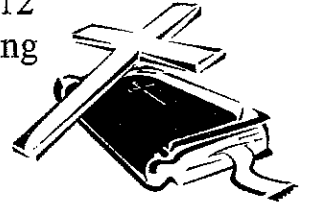
